SPEAKERS AT RCCI VITF URGE TO REVIVE SAARC



The Rawalpindi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (RCCI) organized Virtual International Trade Forum (Chapter SAARC). The purpose of the trade forum was to make the business community aware of trade and export opportunities in SAARC countries.

The forum was attended by President Mohammad Nasir Mirza, Senior Vice President Osman Ashraf, Vice President Shahraiz A Malik, Chairman regional trade Khurshid Berlas, Zubair Malik, Executive member SAARC Chamber, Ahsan Ali Mangi, President Pak-Afghan Chamber Zubair Motiwala, Deputy Secretary Ministry of Commerce Fahad Raza, Ms. Assma Kamal , Trade and Investment Attache Sri Lanka, Suleman Khan, Trade and Investment Attache Bangladesh and Asif Khan, Trade and Investment Counsellor Afghanistan.

President RCCI Nasir Mirza in his welcome address said that the South Asian Association of Regional Cooperation (SAARC) was founded in 1985 with the aim of promoting socio-economic development within the member states but unfortunately the member countries could not materialized the true potential of this forum

SAARC region with its significant economic power, vast natural resources, and dynamic workforce, has a huge development

potential which needs exploration in the better interest of all member nations, he added.

RCCI chief said that regional cooperation has the potential to produce significant gains across all countries of South Asia. Intraregional trade now stands at just one-third of its potential with \$23 billion annually.

Pakistan Afghanistan Joint Chamber of Commerce & Industry (PAJCCI), acknowledged initiatives of RCCI for organizing the SAARC trade forum and raising the voice of the business community with respect to regional trade.

He said SAARC should not be played in the hands of one country and the member countries should synergies their efforts for promoting trade ties excluding India.

Commercial Secretary Dhaka, Salman Khan said that there is a huge potential to increase bilateral trade between Pakistan and Bangladesh, adding that Business Visas relaxation tariff barriers and flight issues has been raised at the Government levels.

Ms. Assma Kamal , Trade and Investment Attache Sri Lanka said that the recent visit of Prime Minister Imran Khan to Sri Lanka has put a positive image and two countries have agreed to further strengthen bilateral relations in diverse areas, including trade, and tourism through enhanced connectivity.

The SAARC region is composed of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and the Maldives. Though it is home to around a quarter of the world's population, the region accounts for just under seven per cent of the world's GDP.

COMMISSIONER PESSI VISITS RCCI, ANNOUNCED HELP DESK AT CHAMBER

Punjab Employees Social Security Institution (PESSI) Commissioner Syed Bilal Haider along with his team visited the Rawalpindi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (RCCI).

Director Raza Ahmed, President Chamber Muhammad Nasir Mirza, Senior Vice President Osman Ashraf, former President Saboor Malik, executive committee members and chamber members were also present on the occasion.

The Commissioner briefed the business community and chamber members in detail on the important steps taken by PESSI regarding registration and welfare of workers.

The Commissioner PESSI announced the formation of an advisory council in which the business community would be represented so that they could be taken on board for policy making and measures on the welfare and registration of workers.

A help desk will be set up in the Chamber of Commerce for the convenience of the members. An amnesty scheme is also being introduced in which factory owners will be given a 50 per cent discount. Inspectors will not raid any factory in the future. An online payment system has been set up. Self-assessment and registration will be inspected once in five years. Fourteen different types of facilities and services are being provided to the workers. Death grant has been increased to 600,000 and marriage grant to 300,000.

The referral systems for medical treatment being eliminated.

Scholarships will be paid directly into the account. Certificates and events will be held to encourage employers who deposit more and regularly. The Commissioner appreciated the rainwater harvesting and recharge system installed by the Rawalpindi Chamber and also agreed to replicate the same at PESSI building in Rawalpindi.

He appreciated the efforts of the Chamber for the promotion of business activities. On this occasion, the President of the Chamber Nasir Mirza briefed the Commissioner on the ongoing activities of the Chamber. He said that Rawalpindi Institute of Cardiology should be included in the panel of PESSI. He welcomed the announcement of the amnesty scheme and said that the chamber would extend all possible support to the awareness campaign in this regard.

Federal Minister for Railways Azam Khan Swati while addressing a conference on investment in Railways Land organized by Rawalpindi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (RCCI) through video link said that unfortunately Railways has been in disrepute for the last 70 years.

I want to send a message to all developers and investors to invest with security in railways land. The investment will be under a public-private partnership. You will have the full support of my team, he added.

The legal process in this regard will be completed by April 30. He lauded RCCI for making this conference possible. The Railway Minister further said that we all have to lift the railways together. There is no place for a corrupt officer in the railways. Professional officers are a source of pride for me. This is an important opportunity for the business community to take advantage of this

opportunity and start thinking for joint ventures on railway land. Hafeez ullah Khan, DG Land & Property, gave a detailed presentation on the traditional method of leasing railway land and the initiatives taken under the new program, Public Private Partnership.

Earlier in his address, RCCI President Mohammad Nasir Mirza said that the aim of the conference was to provide a platform for investors to get maximum information on investing opportunities in railway land. He said that Railways is an important sector in Pakistan's economy. Group leader Sohail Altaf said the railways would have to work to boost investor confidence. Steps will have to be taken to attract local and foreign investors.

Speaking at the occasion, RCCI President Mohammad Nasir Mirza gave a short summary on RCCI current and ongoing programs. Tourism, Pharmaceutical and IT are key sectors where possible joint ventures can be made.

Pakistan and Nepal should focus on developing strong business linkages between their private sectors in order to explore all untapped areas of bilateral trade and economic relations as the current volume of trade was far less than the actual potential of both countries.

He informed that RCCI has been organizing "Made in Pakistan" exhibition in Nepal and expressed hope that once we get out of COVID-19 we will resume the expo.
