Air Conditioners, Challenges to Environment and Solutions

Today, air conditioning is an essential part of every household or commercial unit in Pakistan and much of the world. Earlier, air conditioning was major part of Industrial Units, however, with the passage of time, now we depend on it to cool and climate-control our homes, office buildings, and automobiles. To improve our lives, it is often presented as a simple choice that consumers make and its not a luxury now, but a necessity. According to the International Energy Agency data, there are about 1.6 billion heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) units in the world. This number will grow to 5.6 billion by 2030. With rising global temperatures and increasingly severe heat waves, much of the world's population is vulnerable to the growing health risks of extreme heat. Cooling is critical for human wellbeing, health and the functioning of society. It enables thermal comfort of societies at high temperatures and is critical for industrial production and for the preservation of food and medicine. All these HVAC units increase greenhouse gas emissions through increased energy use, but they also leak hydro fluorocarbons (HFCs), which are thousands of times more potent that carbon dioxide. Many people associate air conditioning systems with heavy environmental impact, and in the case of the largest or oldest systems, that's not an unfair assumption. Environmental friendliness has always been something of a hot topic when it comes to air conditioning However, increasingly, modern air conditioning systems are becoming rapidly more environmentally friendly. The technology is always improving and we now can see a big shift with respect to efficiency, size and smart application to make HVACR more environment friendly. Modern air conditioning manufacturers are using carefully sourced materials, and are hard at work making systems more sustainable than

ever. Most of the companies in Pakistan now make it its mission to reduce energy consumption in order to improve people's comfort and contribute to reducing global warming. Companies are conducting quantitative environmental assessments for each product life cycle in order to develop products and services that use minimal electricity and to combine these in order to optimize the overall energy consumption of buildings. For example, Daiken Pakistan has incorporated inverter technology to reduce power consumption, it employ R-32, a refrigerant with low global warming potential, to achieve greater energy efficiency. Daikin designs products to be small and lightweight to conserve resources and uses materials common in all products in consideration of recyclability. In production processes, we not only promote the recycling of waste generated, but also strive to eliminate the amount of waste that occurs. Further, we regard water shortages as a social issue posing an operational risk, thus we are enhancing our management of water used in production processes and strive to conserve water resources. In fiscal 2019, we reduced CO2 emissions from residential air conditioners by about 21% and from commercial air conditioners by about 26% compared to life cycle CO2 emissions 10 years earlier. Improving the energy efficiency of existing VRV multi-split type air conditioners for commercial buildings is an important part of reducing energy consumption. We introduced Daikin's Retrofit System, a new maintenance service that boosts the energy efficiency of currently installed equipment. Using technology for replacing parts in the control panel, the air conditioner's brain, and the compressor, the machine's heart, the Retrofit System reduces power consumption by 15% a year.



The Rawalpindi Chamber of Commerce and Industry (RCCI) has appealed to the government to ease the smart lockdown. According to the National Command Operation Center (NCOC), the number of daily Corona cases has decreased. Lockdown on Eid and closure of inter-provincial and inter-city public transport have significantly reduced the number of corona cases.

RCCI President Mohammad Nasir Mirza in a statement said that the business community has been most affected by the corona. People in the hotel industry in particular have been hit hard. Restaurants, wedding halls and marquees should be allowed to open businesses under SOPs. There are thousands of people whose job is associated with these wedding halls and restaurants, he added. Wedding halls should be opened under specific /restricted number of guests and shall

be allowed under SOPs, he appealed.

At the same time, the tourism sector and related industry has also faced big losses. He said that lockdown policy should be formulated in collaboration with stakeholders. We have to make a policy based on the ground realities. Weekly off should be abolished and daily shopping hours be increased, he added. Less working hours increase the rush in the markets, he said. Nasir Mirza said that like the rest of the world, we have to run business life along with COVID.

SOPs, masks and social distance should trade associations extend all possible cooperation for the implementation of the SOPs.

RCCI Delegation calls Commissioner Rawalpindi, Discuss Progress on Development Projects

He said that the government is making every effort to keep the wheel of industry running fast and the business community, especially the industrialists, to face less interference from government agencies. He said he would soon visit the chamber and meet with the business community. Talking to Commissioner Rawalpindi, President RCCI Nasir Mirza said that the Chamber has always worked actively with the Commissioner's Office for the development projects of the city. The Ring Road project is important to be completed immediately without any further delay. The Rawalpindi Chamber will extend all kinds of assistance and cooperation. He also gave a briefing to the Commissioner on the ongoing programs of the Chamber. He said that the chamber has always demanded that the chamber and the business community be taken on board for the development projects of the city. The link road of Rawat Industrial Estate, Parking Plaza, By-Laws, IT Park were also discussed in detail.



Subject: INTRODUCTION OF AMNESTY SCHEME

Dear Mirza Sb,

I hope that this letter finds you in the best of your health and spirit.

- 2. In order to facilitate the business community as a part of Ease of Doing Business, the Government of Punjab has initiated numerous steps including the introduction of Amnesty Scheme in payment of arrears of Social Security Contribution for the defaulter establishments by making amendments in Provincial Employees' Social Security Ordinance, 1965.
- 3. According to said amendment considerable relief has been given to the employers by addition of 3rd proviso to Section 23 (1). Owing to this proviso, if employer pays his unpaid contribution (Principal Amount) till 30.06.2021, statutory increase @ 50% of the principal amount under section 23(1) of the Ordinance booked against the unpaid contribution shall stand waived off. However, if such amnesty is not availed by the employer till 30.06.2021, the employer will be liable to pay principal amount as well as 50% increase booked on such unpaid contribution.
- 4. It is, therefore, requested to induce all your members to get benefit from the Amnesty Scheme before the time runs out and clear their dues (principal amount) at the earliest. The relevant material/ pamphlets have already been provided by this office.
- Co-operation in the matter would be highly appreciated, please.
